ROAD TO BRAZIL

VAUXHALL STATS PACK: WALES NO.2

Vauxhall is delighted to be partnering Wales on the road to Brazil in 2014.

Wales were placed in Group A of the FIFA World Cup Qualifying draw, which took place in Rio de Janeiro, and they will face Croatia, Serbia, Scotland and Macedonia.

WALES

Gareth Bale is set to play for Wales the first time under Gary Speed after being named in the 25-man squad for this friendly against Australia in Cardiff.

Injury has forced the Tottenham Hotspur winger to miss all four of Speed's games since he took over in December.

Swansea are well represented in the squad. The Premier League newcomers have Ashley Williams, Neil Taylor and Joe Allen return after missing May's 2-0 friendly win over Northern Ireland. And two more Swans, Ashley Richards and David Cotterill, are in the Stand-by squad.

Speed has included Manchester City striker Craig Bellamy and the manager believes he is ready for the challenge, saying: "I would imagine Craig will be champing at the bit. He has been training but he hasn't had many games so hopefully that will be the case.

"We will see how he goes. If he is able to get through the 90 minutes, which I am sure he would like, then great. If he can't, we will make a change. I would like his future to be sorted for his sake because I know how passionate he is about his football."

There are also places for Celtic duo Adam Matthews and Joe Ledley, although the latter missed the friendly defeat to Swansea in last midweek due to a niggle picked up against Inter Milan.

Speed suffered three withdrawals over the weekend with Wolves' striker Sam Vokes pulling out with an ankle injury. Norwich's Andrew Crofts (ankle) and James Collins, of Aston Villa (back), are also missing. As a result, Inverness Caledonian Thistle's Owain Tudur Jones has been promoted from the stand-by squad.

AUSTRALIA

Meanwhile, Australia arrive in buoyant mood. On March 30, manager Holger Osieck lead Australia to a shock 2-1 victory over his home nation in Mönchengladbach, even though he was without top goal scorer Tim Cahill.

And for this game, Australia have handed Middlesbrough striker Scott McDonald another chance, but there is no place for Harry Kewell in their 18-man squad.

Captain Lucas Neill, who is currently unattached, will feature, while Mark Schwarzer and Everton's Tim Cahill, who missed the friendlies against Serbia and New Zealand, are back in the fold.

Korean-based defender Luke DeVere has been given his first call-up since early 2010 and could make his debut, while Japan-based Matthew Spiranovic is included as Osieck looks to the next generation.

Matt McKay is the only A-League based player with Jason Culina not considered as he regains full fitness.

THE MANAGERS

GARY SPEED (WALES)

Now 41, Speed was the obvious choice to replace John Toshack as manager of the country for whom he played with so much pride and distinction.

Speed represented his country on 85 occasions and remains the most capped outfield player in Welsh history.

And, at domestic level he held the record for the most appearances in the Premiership at 535, until it was surpassed by goalkeeper David James.

He began his managerial career with Sheffield United, replacing Kevin Blackwell at Bramall Lane early in the 2010-11 season.

But when Wales came calling, last September, the lure was too great and, with United's blessing, he was a popular choice as the country's new manager.

Speed enjoyed his first win as an international manager in May when Wales beat Northern Ireland 1-0 in the Carling Nations Cup in Dublin.



HOLGER OSIECK (AUSTRALIA)

The 62-year-old German celebrates his first year as Australia's head coach, this week having been appointed on August 11, 2010.

In January 2011, he led the team to the final of the Asian Cup, before a 1-0 extra-time defeat by Japan 1-0.

Osieck was widely praised for an otherwise outstanding campaign that included a victory over defending champions Iraq in the Quarter-Finals, and a shock 6-0 defeat of Uzbekistan in the Semi-Finals

On March 30, Osieck led Australia to a shock 2-1 victory over his home in Mönchengladbach, even though he was without top goal scorer Tim Cahill.

Previously, Osieck travelled extensively. After finishing his playing career in Canada, Osieck became an assistant coach to Franz Beckenbauer for the Germany national football team that won the 1990 World Cup.

He then managed VfL Bochum in Germany before a spell in Turkey with Fenerbahçe S.K. and in Japan, with Urawa Red Diamonds (Japan).

He returned to Turkey with Kocaelispor before he landed the job of manager of the Canadian national team in 1999.

Under Osieck, Canada won the 2000 CONCACAF Gold Cup, earning the nickname "Holger's Heroes" He worked for FIFA between 2004 and 2006 as chief of their technical department. In 2007, he again became the manager of Urawa and led the club to win the 2007 AFC Champions League.
